
Washington's Forests

- > Washington state has about 22M acres of forests and 8.58M acres of those are "working forests" (State and private forests combined) which are forests that are managed to generate revenue.
- > Around **91.3% of these working forests are certified** for sustainable harvesting by international bodies.
 - These forests are predominantly (90%) Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) certified followed by Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) and American Tree Farm System certified.




Ownership and product distribution in WA

Distribution of forest ownership types in WA




Average wood products in WA's wood products industry



FIA Plots in Washington state by owner class










Washington Softwood Lumber Production








U.S. West Lumber Production by Species








Pacific Northwest Coastal and Inland Lumber Prices






Washington State Average Timber Prices (stumpage)






Washington Timber Harvests by Ownership

U.S. Dollars, Monthly, January 2018 - October 2022






